Enchanted Light Fiber Optic Project Update

The Enchanted Light Fiber Optic Project is funded through a grant of \$44 million and a loan of \$19.3 million by the U.S.D.A Rural Utility Service. This was a highly competitive process, which we were very fortunate to have funded. In the short term it means jobs. We anticipate 300 local workers will be getting a much needed paycheck when both the overhead and underground portions of the project are being built. In the long term it means jobs too. When the company is spun off upon completion there will be positions available for technicians, call center personnel, salespeople and administrators. In addition, many companies and individuals who have been unable to do business in Taos due to inadequate internet speeds will now be able to do business as they would in any big city with high speed broadband connectivity.

We have a local labor force of about 200 working on the project at this point. They are presently constructing the network in Arroyo Hondo, Arroyo Seco, Angel Fire, Weimer Foothills and overhead lines between Amalia and Questa. We will keep you informed on progress as we moved toward bringing high speed internet service to our members.

KCEC has been beta-testing Virtual Fiber in the Pot Creek area using wireless transmitters. The transmitters broadcast to a specific area and make available much higher speeds than DSL. Doug Swinehart, local CPA at CPA Southwest,

gave us his review of the Virtual fiber test:

"The high speed access is just what I needed in order to do work from home without the frustration of a dial-up connection. In the past, it was actually faster for me to drive 10 miles in to town to access high speed than wait for the dial-up info to make the trip to my computer. The installation was painless and professional and the support has been outstanding." Doug Swinehart
